Administrative Law in the Circuit Community – Administrative law issues arise in all of the Circuit's jurisdictions, including government contracts, personnel, trademarks, and trade. In 1999, the Supreme Court reversed the Federal Circuit in *Zurko* and settled any doubt that the Patent Office is an administrative agency, subject to the requirements of the APA.
